

THE TRAILS

Located in Tupper Lake, NY this free winter trail system is groomed for Nordic skiing with skate lanes available on the wider sections. Snowshoeing and fat tire biking are both welcome and encouraged, but please stay to the sides of the set ski tracks. The trails are dog friendly. Please pick up after your dog and bring a leash, just in case.

All grooming equipment is provided and maintained by the Town of Tupper Lake. Grooming is done by a group of volunteers dedicated to providing a great ski experience.

Trails are suitable for skiers of all abilities. Special events are also planned throughout the season, such as a youth ski race, Full Moon Ski Nights with a bonfire, and the Tupper Lake BrewSki.

Special Events

Throughout the season, events such as The Lumberjack Scramble, Full Moon Ski Nights with a bonfire, and the annual Tupper Lake BrewSki are hosted at the trail system. The BrewSki is a mile and a half beer trail that takes place each February. Participants ski, bike, or snowshoe to different stations, enjoy craft beer from local brewers around the region as they mingle by fire pits at each location.

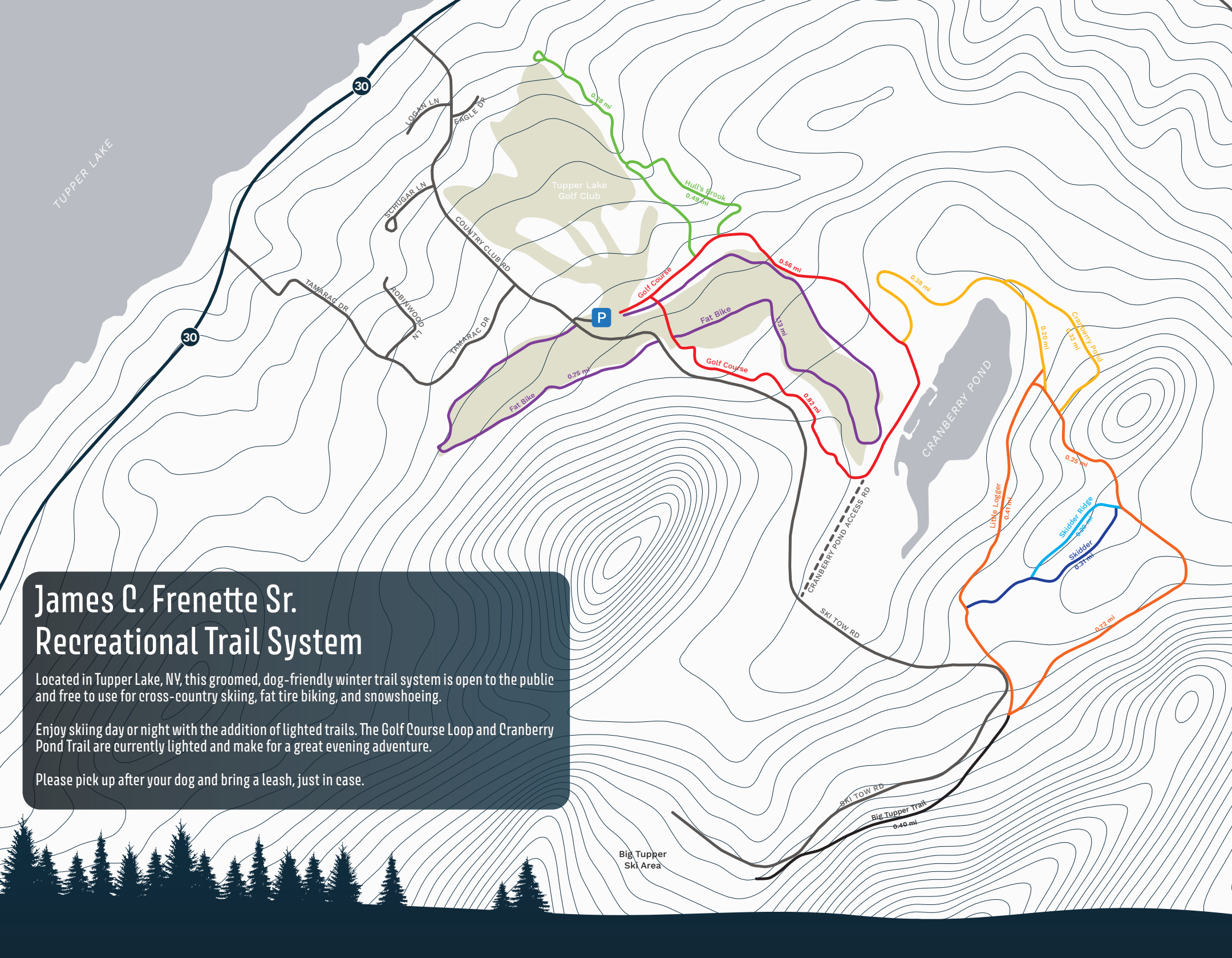
